

COMMUNICATIONS INTERN (REMOTE)

The National Breast Cancer Coalition seeks a driven, results-oriented intern to help us build our communications capacity, both in media outreach and development efforts.

Since 1991, The National Breast Cancer Coalition has been at the vanguard of the breast cancer movement – elevating breast cancer to an issue of national significance, leveraging billions of federal dollars for research and care, and empowering tens of thousands of breast cancer survivors to become effective advocates for themselves, and all those at risk of breast cancer. NBCC is the organization that will end breast cancer; we are activists who set a research agenda to ensure that outcome, who tell the truth about breast cancer, upend the status quo, and empower survivors to be leaders for this cause.

This unpaid remote position provides practical experience in the communications field, as well as the opportunity to promote the organization's commitment to ending breast cancer.

Primary Purpose: Intern will assist the communications and advancement team with tasks related to media outreach, development communications, multimedia work, and general external communications.

Duties include:

- Assist with the drafting of selected press releases, social media posts, newsletter content, and other communications materials;
- Monitor and research communications messaging within the breast cancer community;
- Research family and corporate foundations to support the development team and potentially draft grant proposals;
- Develop social media messaging related to year-end campaigns;
- Interview members and advocates and develop storytelling pieces for the e-newsletter, website and social media:
- And support development communications through writing and administrative tasks;

This internship is **unpaid**; we will work with individuals to obtain academic credit if available. The Ideal candidate will be a junior, senior or graduate in college. Gained benefits: hands-on work experience, valuable addition to your writing portfolio, in-depth education about the world of nonprofits and health advocacy on the national level and flexible work schedule.

The position requires:

- Strong writing and oral communications skills
- A desire to learn as well as dedication to the internship, and a strong work ethic
- Ability to work independently with great attention to detail
- Professional attitude and timely delivery of projects
- Must be able to intern at least two (partial or full) days a week
