

Dear Colleague,

We urge you to become a cosponsor of S. 663, the Metastatic Breast Cancer Access to Care Act. This legislation would waive all waiting periods for Medicare and Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) for eligible individuals suffering from metastatic breast cancer. This legislation received support from thousands of patient advocates across the country, with a full list of supporting organizations below.

This year, about 43,250 women and 530 men will die of breast cancer. The vast majority of breast cancer deaths are due to metastatic breast cancer, which is cancer that has spread from the breast to the bones, lungs, or other distant parts of the body. There is no cure – and under current law, most people diagnosed with metastatic breast cancer do not live long enough to receive the benefits they would qualify for due to waiting periods. Intensive, immediate treatment can be a difference-maker in disease progression and quality of life, but instead many with metastatic breast cancer face costly medical expenses and difficult choices like delaying necessary treatment.

There are federal precedents for eliminating waiting periods for certain individuals who qualify for SSDI and Medicare benefits based on their disability. In 1978, Congress eliminated Medicare waiting periods for individuals with End-Stage Renal Disease (ESRD) receiving home dialysis treatments. In 2001, Congress passed legislation to add Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis (ALS) as a qualifying condition for automatic Medicare coverage, eliminating the 24 month waiting period. Most recently, in 2020 Congress passed legislation to eliminate the five-month waiting period for individuals who qualify for SSDI based on their disability.

While we must do more to encourage new treatments and cures, increase access to medical care, reduce health disparities, and raise awareness for patients with MBC, eliminating onerous waiting periods for SSDI and Medicare is a meaningful step for women and their families. The average life expectancy for women diagnosed with MBC is only three years: we must eliminate barriers that could delay critically necessary treatment.
