NBCC is a four-star CharityNavigator nonprofit, a Better Business Bureau Accredited Charity, and a gold-level GuideStar/Candid participant.

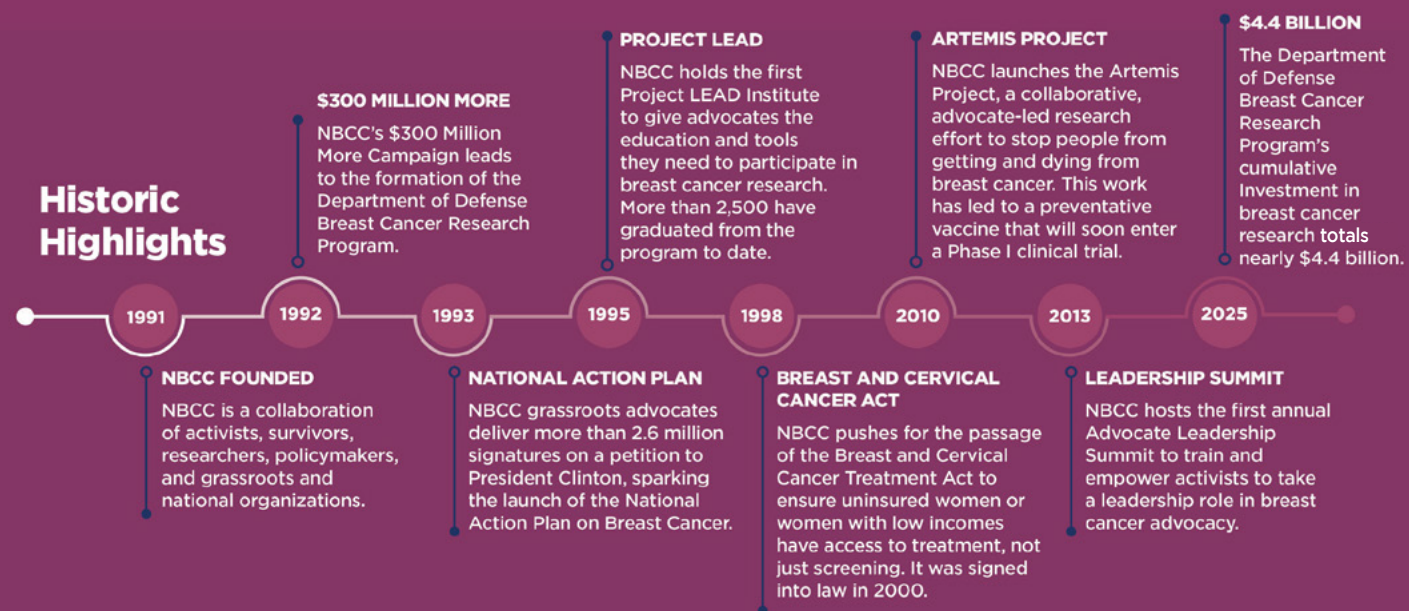

Wall Foundation's continued commitment to breast cancer advocacy

model, activist, and two-time breast cancer survivor.

Carol Vance Wall became a part of NBCC soon after our  
launch and her breast cancer diagnosis, and we are forever  
grateful. There isn't a single aspect of NBCC that Carol did  
not touch, and we are a better, stronger organization for it.  
As our first major donor, Carol chaired many NBCC  
campaigns and events and became the prime sponsor of  
Project LEAD, our one-of-a-kind science training program  
for breast cancer advocates. She followed science and  
understood it at a level that few other advocates could  
match. She helped us connect with policymakers and  
expanded our advocate and supporter network.

But more than that, she was a down-to-earth, funny,  
brilliant woman with a huge heart. She was my dear friend,  
and an NBCC supporter and leader until her death from  
metastatic breast cancer in June 2022. I miss her terribly.  
Advocacy takes many forms. When powerful, influential  
women like Linda Evangelista speak out about their breast  
cancer, they inspire others to come forward, share their  
stories, and use their voices to enact change. Linda, we  
are grateful for your bravery and honesty and all you have  
done to expand awareness of the realities of this disease.

That reality includes the fact that we still do not know  
how to end deaths from breast cancer. Carol Wall is one  
of the thousands of mothers, sisters, daughters, aunts,  
and friends we have lost to breast cancer over the past  
30 years. They are why NBCC's work is so important.

We envision a world where no more lives are lost to  
this disease. From securing billions in research funding  
to expanding health care access, NBCC is dedicated  
to real progress and to systems change.

We train and empower breast cancer advocates to  
make their voices heard wherever decisions about  
breast cancer are made—in Washington, DC, and state  
capitals; in laboratories and health care institutions;

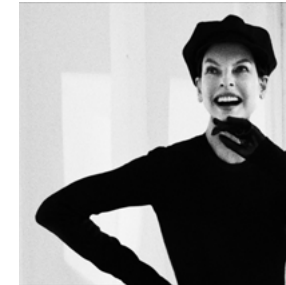

Established in 1990, the Vance Wall Foundation has long supported NBCC's programs, most notably its Project LEAD and the Artemis Project.

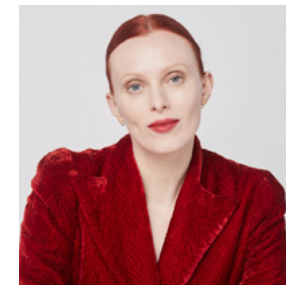
## LINDA EVANGELISTA 2025 LEADERSHIP AWARD HONOREE



Linda Evangelista is one of the most influential models of all time, a celebrated muse for generations of photographers, designers, and fashion creatives. Throughout her career, Linda has used her global platform to champion causes close to her heart. A two-time breast cancer survivor, she is a vocal advocate for cancer research, AIDS/HIV awareness, racial equality, body positivity, and LGBTQ+ rights.

Outside of fashion, Linda added co-author to her list of accomplishments with the publication of the photography book *Linda Evangelista Photographed by Steven Meisel*, a sumptuous tome celebrating her decades-long friendship and collaboration with the legendary photographer. Additionally, Linda was one of the executive producers of Apple TV+'s critically acclaimed docuseries *The Super Models*, highlighting the impact of her role in the pop cultural zeitgeist. Today, Linda remains dedicated to using her influence for meaningful change.

## AWARD PRESENTATION BY SPECIAL GUEST KAREN ELSON



Karen Elson is an English model, singer/songwriter, and author who has shaped fashion and entertainment for over two decades. At 18, she broke beauty norms with an iconic *Vogue Italia* cover by Steven Meisel and has since appeared on 50 *Vogue* covers and walked for major fashion houses like McQueen, Chanel, and Valentino. She has authored *The Red Flame*, a coming-of-age memoir, released three acclaimed albums, and enjoyed a residency at NYC's legendary Cafe Carlyle. In 2023, she was the subject of Emily Dorio's "see you me" exhibit at Nashville's Parthenon museum. Karen splits her time between Nashville and NYC.

## BONNIE ANDERSON

### 2025 GRASSROOTS ADVOCACY HONOREE



Bonnie Anderson is a strong, passionate advocate who wants to end breast cancer. Bonnie, a clinical nurse from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, was diagnosed with breast cancer in 1993. She realized that many women faced far greater challenges than she had experienced in accessing treatment and thus began her breast cancer advocacy journey.

After being recruited by a local doctor to apply for NBCC's Project LEAD, Bonnie says, "I got bit by the advocacy bug and realized NBCC was the right fit for me."

Bonnie has attended Project LEAD advanced classes and serves as a Team Leader on public policy, leading Wisconsin delegates on Capitol Hill and lobbying for NBCC's agenda. Bonnie is a past President of the Wisconsin Breast Cancer Coalition and serves on the NBCC Board of Directors, representing ABCD: After Breast Cancer Diagnosis.

"NBCC is the only organization I know that is going to support the research and the policies that will end this disease," she says.

Bonnie has served in many leadership roles, including a Reach to Recovery Volunteer for the American Cancer Society and a Mentor for ABCD: After Breast Cancer Diagnosis. She has served as the Survivor Recognition Chair as well as a Board member for the Susan G. Komen for the Cure Milwaukee Affiliate. She has also served on the Department of Defense Breast Cancer Research Program Peer Review Panel.

Fourteen years ago, Bonnie started a new initiative, Nurses Affecting Change. Through this program she built a team of Nurse Practitioners and Nurse Clinicians to directly serve the African American community in Milwaukee. Their work serves more than 2000 women per year, from the point of screening to diagnosis and treatment. She is affectionately known as "the breast cancer lady" throughout the community and convenes meetings every Saturday to support local women.

Bonnie works at the Milwaukee Catholic Home as the wellness nurse manager. She is married and has 3 adult children.

## JUDY PERKINS

### 2025 GRASSROOTS ADVOCACY HONOREE



Judy Perkins would say she owes her life to her involvement with NBCC. Judy was diagnosed with metastatic breast cancer in 2013. A retired engineer, she became involved with patient advocacy at first to learn more about her own diagnosis. Given her keen interest in science and research advocacy, mentors encouraged her to get involved in the work of the National Breast Cancer Coalition.

Since 2014, she has continued to lobby for increased federal funding for breast cancer research. She currently serves as the Florida Team Leader for NBCC and as an alternate on the NBCC Board of Directors, representing the Florida Breast Cancer Foundation.

After participating in a failed clinical trial, Judy learned about a new trial offered by the National Institutes of Health while attending NBCC's Project LEAD. In 2015, Judy became the first breast cancer patient to be treated with immunotherapy using tumor infiltrating lymphocytes. She is the only known breast cancer patient to have had a complete response. She has remained cancer free since 2016.

News of the clinical trial was published in Nature Medicine in 2018 and has since been featured in a variety of news reports worldwide. Judy continues to use her platform to educate people about the importance of clinical trials and patient advocacy. "I want people to know that not only might participating in a clinical trial help you live longer," says Perkins, "but your participation is doing good for the people coming after you."

In 2018, Judy joined the National Cancer Institute Central Institutional Review Board, which provides oversight for clinical trials. She has also served as a consumer reviewer for the Department of Defense Breast Cancer Research Program. She regularly assists the NIH and NCI as a patient advocate reviewing grant proposals. She volunteers with the Alamo Breast Cancer Foundation, another NBCC Board organization, to support their Advocate Scholarship Program.

An avid adventurer, Judy can often be found skiing or kayaking in the wilderness.

LAURA BELL BUNDY  
SPECIAL GUEST PERFORMER



Laura Bell Bundy is a Tony-nominated Broadway actress and Billboard top five recording artist. Bundy made her debut at age 9 in Radio City Music Hall’s *Christmas Spectacular*. She has originated the stage roles Tina in *Ruthless* (Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle Award nominations), Amber in Broadway’s *Hairspray*, and most notably Elle Woods in *Legally Blonde The Musical* (Tony nomination), and Sylvia in Broadway’s *The Cottage*. She also took a turn as Glinda in *Wicked* on Broadway.

Bundy has appeared in numerous films and over 100 episodes of television, including *Call Me Kat*, *The New Fairly Odd Parents— Fairly Odder*, *Perfect Harmony*, *How I Met Your Mother/Father*, *Hart of Dixie*, *American Gods*, *Anger Management*, *Good Behavior*, *Scream Queens*, *Documentary Now*, *Dream Girls*, and *Jumanji*.

Bundy has recorded multiple albums as a Universal Music Group & Big Machine Label artist and was a Sony Publishing songwriter. She has toured with Rascal Flatts, Blake Shelton, Dwight Yoakam, Miranda Lambert, and others.

As a writer and composer, she created and developed *Mashville* for Netflix and *Girl Time* for Freeform.

Her latest album, *Women of Tomorrow*, tackles the double standards women face today and is currently being adapted for Broadway. The companion podcast dives into these issues, and the community and app empower women in all aspects of their lives.

When not performing, Bundy and her husband Thom are restoring their 73-acre farm in New Jersey with three sheep, four goats, two dogs, and a vineyard. Her favorite job is being Huck’s mom.
