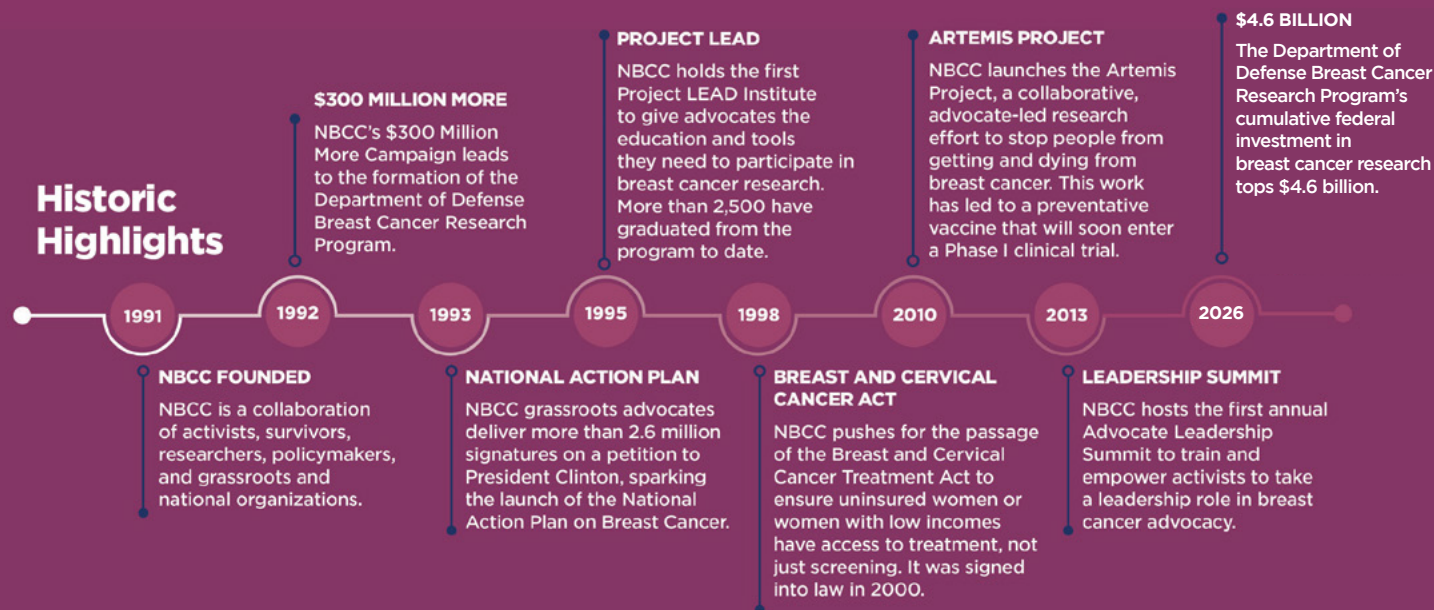
OUR MISSION: TO END BREAST CANCER THROUGH THE POWER OF ACTION AND ADVOCACY.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT OF THE OF THE NATIONAL BREAST CANCER COALITION



ON BEHALF OF THE NATIONAL BREAST CANCER COALITION (NBCC), WELCOME TO OUR ANNUAL NEW YORK GALA.

Tonight, we honor longtime NBCC supporter and friend Musa Mayer, an author, incredible breast cancer advocate, and president of the Guston Foundation. We also pay tribute to the legacy of Congresswoman Nita Lowey, a transformative leader in public service, a lifelong champion for women's health, and a dedicated advocate for change.

We are also proud to present the 2026 Grassroots Advocacy Award to two breast cancer survivors whose personal journeys fuel their unwavering commitment to ending this disease: Nancy Levitan Poorvu and Terlisa Sheppard.

Musa Mayer has been a part of NBCC for more than 30 years, enriching our mission with her formidable intellect, passion for science, and dedication to ending breast cancer. She graciously stepped up whenever we asked, agreeing to sit on scientific committees, advising on clinical trials, and developing education and training for lay advocates. I do not know another advocate who understands science as well as Musa.

I vividly recall a clinical trial investigator who was on a steering committee with Musa, telling me that Musa knew more than most of the doctors sitting around the table—which we already knew. She sets the standard for NBCC science advocacy. And we were thrilled she chose to bring her unmatched skills to NBCC.

NBCC launched a couple of years after Nita Lowey took her seat in Congress. From the beginning, she was a trusted partner and fierce advocate for our mission, championing NBCC legislation and priorities in the halls of the US Capitol. She had the ability to wield her leadership well and for good, and the courage to speak out for what she knew was right.

During the push for NBCC's Breast Cancer and Environmental Research Act, Nita stepped up as a lead sponsor. And when the National Institutes of Health (NIH) made it clear they were not supportive, I sat in her office as she picked up the phone, called the NIH director, and suggested we discuss any concerns directly. We hashed out our differences, and the bill was introduced. It was an amazing moment for the breast cancer movement.

Nita passed away from breast cancer last March. This year, an estimated 42,670 women and 530 men in this country will also die of the disease.

NBCC envisions a world where no one dies from breast cancer. From securing billions in research funding to expanding health care access, NBCC is dedicated to real progress and systems change.

During a time when research funding and access to health care are at risk, our ability to build on our momentum and make a difference is largely thanks to you: those who believe in NBCC and in our mission to end breast cancer.

A special thank you to gala co-chairs Dorian Goldman and Marvin Israelow, Katja Goldman and Michael Sonnenfeldt, Stephen Lowey, and Tom Mayer, and committee members Alec Call and Bryan Johns and Ann E. Goldberg.

And thanks most of all to the breast cancer survivors who are here tonight and with us every step of the way.

On behalf of hundreds of breast cancer organizations and tens of thousands of advocates who make up NBCC, as well as the more than 4 million women and thousands of men in the US living with a history of breast cancer, thank you for your support. We are grateful to have you on our side.

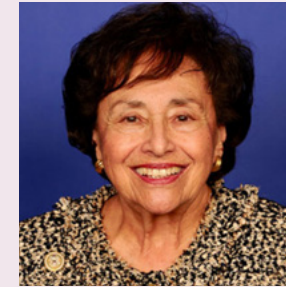
MUSA MAYER 2026 LEADERSHIP AWARD HONOREE



Musa Mayer is a survivor, advocate, and author of three books on breast cancer. She became involved with the National Breast Cancer Coalition in the early 1990s and graduated from Project LEAD. Over the next 20 years, Musa's advocacy focused on people living with metastatic breast cancer. She wrote the first patient handbook and many articles for patients and professionals. Her patient surveys helped expand services among support organizations. As a research advocate, she served on steering and data monitoring committees for clinical trials and patient registries, on FDA advisory committees, and on a Department of Defense BCRP Center of Excellence grant on brain metastasis. With the U.S. Cochrane Center at Johns Hopkins, she co-authored a free web-course for advocates on evidence-based healthcare taken by thousands of advocates and healthcare workers around the world.

In the past decade, as president of The Guston Foundation at PhilipGuston.org, Musa has worked to ensure the legacy of her father, the painter Philip Guston, publishing several books on his life and work. Support for the National Breast Cancer Coalition and its advocacy remains close to her heart.

A TRIBUTE TO THE LEGACY OF CONGRESSWOMAN NITA LOWEY



Nita M. Lowey was a transformative leader in public service, a lifelong champion for women's health and an amazing breast cancer advocate.

Over more than three decades representing New York in the U.S. House of Representatives, she played a pivotal role in advancing policies that expanded breast cancer research, protected access to care, and upheld science-based decision making.

From the earliest days of the National Breast Cancer Coalition, she was a trusted partner and fierce advocate for its mission to end breast cancer. Her leadership helped move NBCC's agenda forward. She was the primary sponsor of the Breast Cancer Environmental Research Act, a staunch supporter of the Department of Defense Peer Reviewed Breast Cancer Research Program, and a leader on the Breast and Cervical Cancer Treatment Act.

Known for her determination and ability to get things done, Nita Lowey brought people together to turn bold ideas into real progress. This tribute honors her lasting impact on the breast cancer movement and her extraordinary legacy of leadership and service.

NANCY LEVITAN POORVU 2026 GRASSROOTS ADVOCACY HONOREE



Nancy Poorvu MSW, Ph.D., is a retired social work professor, who has taught research methods, clinical practice, and human behavior in the social environment, as well as having a private practice for over 35 years.

The daughter of a breast cancer survivor, Nancy was first diagnosed with breast cancer in 2002 and quickly became a breast cancer advocate for others. She joined the Dana Farber Cancer Institute to create a peer mentor program, SoulMates. It is a rigorous in-person, mentoring, social, learning program for women who are newly diagnosed with breast cancer, matching them with others who are at least three years out from treatment.

Wanting to be involved in science, in 2014, Nancy joined the Dana Farber BC Research Advocates. She participates in yearly internal grant review committees at Dana Farber, as well as the SPORRE grant review committee.

She found NBCC in 2016 and quickly became a leader. She graduated from NBCC's Project LEAD in 2016 and again in 2023. She is an active member of the National Breast Cancer Coalition, taking part in many annual Advocate Leadership Summits and Lobby Days. For the past two years she has served on the NBCC Advocate Leadership Summit Planning Committee.

Nancy has served as a Department of Defense Breast Cancer Research Program peer reviewer for the past five years. She continues to educate herself regarding the science of breast cancer and the work being done to combat the diseases that make up breast cancer.

TERLISA SHEPPARD 2026 GRASSROOTS ADVOCACY HONOREE



Terlisa Sheppard is a four-time breast cancer survivor. She was diagnosed at the age of 31, while 8½ months pregnant and has been living with metastatic breast cancer for 24 years.

Terlisa has found a great passion in connecting with and assisting other patients, survivors, and their families and friends. She has been very active in the National Breast Cancer Coalition and other organizations. She is a graduate of NBCC's Project LEAD and a longtime public policy advocate, having attended many NBCC Advocate Leadership Summits and Lobby Days.

On a local level, she volunteers for and represents the Florida Breast Cancer Foundation, an NBCC Board member organization, by actively participating in state and federal lobbying efforts and hosting informational tables at various conferences throughout the state of Florida.

Terlisa works to educate herself on fundamental scientific principles surrounding breast cancer. She credits Project LEAD with the foundation for her science advocacy and tells other newly diagnosed advocates to take part in NBCC training opportunities.

Terlisa is deeply committed to serving the community, educating others, and helping to eradicate breast cancer. She shares her journey to offer hope, perspective, and encouragement, while empowering others to live fully, even in the face of an advanced illness.

Terlisa has received various awards and recognition and has also been featured in several publications and news articles. She co-authored a best-selling book, *Unbreakable Spirit: Rising Above the Impossible*. Terlisa was honored with the Woman of Courage Award from the National Women's Political Caucus.

CARLY HUGHES SPECIAL GUEST PERFORMER



Originally from St. Louis, Missouri, Carly Hughes grew up in Columbia, Maryland. She was honored with the prestigious Princess Grace Award for Acting and Excellence in the Arts. Best known for her role as Angela on ABC's *American Housewife*, Carly has also made guest appearances on shows such as *Curb Your Enthusiasm* (HBO), *Insatiable* (Netflix), *Dynasty* (CW), and *NCIS* (CBS), among others. She starred in Lifetime's holiday movie *The Christmas Edition* and voices several characters on Disney's animated series *Super Kitties*, and as Jozi on Nickelodeon's *Baby Shark*. Carly has showcased her talent in eight Broadway shows, starring as Velma Kelly in *Chicago*, the Leading Player in *Pippin*, and Lucille/Shirley of the Shirelles in *Beautiful: The Carole King Musical*. She performed her song "Will You Love Me Tomorrow" on the 2014 *Tony® Awards*, *The Today Show*, and *The View*, helping to win the 2015 GRAMMY® for Best Musical Theater Album. Her other Broadway credits include *The Book of Mormon*, *Ghost: The Musical*, *Ragtime*, *The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee*, and *Dr. Seuss' How the Grinch Stole Christmas*. Hughes' diverse talents extend to regional theaters, and she shares her culinary expertise through her Instagram series "Cooking With Carly."

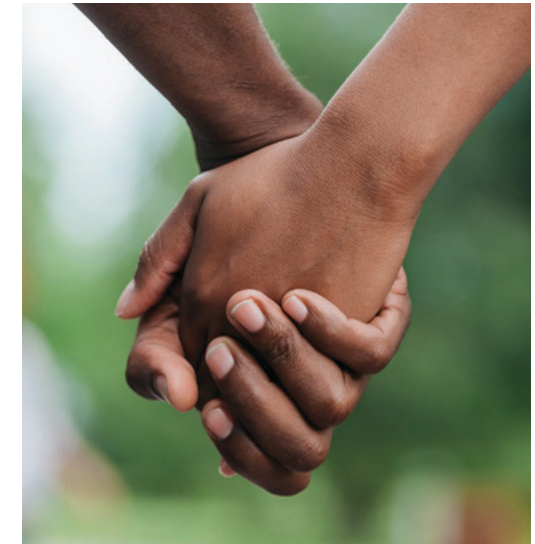
